

Minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Mayor and Council of the City of South Tucson, Arizona, held Monday, December 19, 2016, at 6:00 p.m. at the City of South Tucson Council Chambers, 1601 South 6th Avenue, South Tucson, Arizona.

Mayor Rojas called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m., and led the Pledge of Allegiance. Councilman Lopez led the Invocation.

ITEM #04 – ROLL CALL – All members of the Council were present.

ITEM #05 – APPROVAL OF MINUTES – REGULAR MEETING OF OCTOBER 24, 2016 AND REGULAR MEETING OF NOVEMBER 14, 2016

Motion by Councilman Green to approve the minutes as written. Seconded by Vice-Mayor Patino. Motion passed unanimously.

ITEM #06 – CANVASS GENERAL ELECTION CERTIFICATION OF NOVEMBER 8, 2016

Ms. Moreno: Thank you, Mayor, members of the Council. Item #06 is the Canvass of the General Election and Certification of November 8, 2016. And what you will see here is the canvass, which is the official notice from Pima County Elections Office, showing the official results of the General Election that took place on November 8, 2016. On the ballot were Proposition 441, 443, and 453. Each Proposition passed. And this is the time and place where the Mayor and Council, there is no action required. It's just a presentation of the canvass.

ITEM #07 - INSTALLATION OF NEW COUNCIL MEMBERS

Ms. Moreno: Thank you, Mayor, members of the Council. At the primary election there were four seats for the City Council, where four of the terms on our Council here were up for the end of their term. So at the Primary Election, we did have, I don't have them in front of me, but I do know the results as far as, you know, what the numbers were on the votes. Today would be the time where we, or the Council will, along with the Judge, swear in the newly elected members. So those seats that were the end-of-term, it would expire today. And those would be Mr. Miguel Rojas, Anita Romero, Robert Larribas, and Herman Lopez. Two of the ones I just mentioned won the election and they were successful, and two others that are not here on the seat are new members, which will be Mr. Carlos Romo and Rufino Cantu. So this is the time where our Judge will swear them in and both Mr. Rojas and Herman Lopez will step down in their official capacity as Council for the City of South Tucson.

Mayor Rojas: Would the gentlemen please step forward to the front? And as soon as you get sworn in, you will then stop over here and I will step down and Mr. Lopez will step down.

Ms. Moreno: And we will need to have Mr. Robert Larribas joining them, and also Mrs. Anita Romero, who also were incumbents and were successful in this election as well. So, I don't know if the Judge would like to have all of you perform your loyalty oath of office at the same time. You can have it in front of you so you can follow with him.

Judge Lassen conducted the installation and oath of office of newly elected Council members.

ITEM #08 – ELECTION OF MAYOR

Vice-Mayor Patino: Item #08 will be the Election of the Mayor. Ms. Moreno.

Ms. Moreno: Thank you, Vice-Mayor Patino. Mayor and Council, the next item on the agenda is Item #08, where the Council, in and of yourselves, will elect a Mayor. So we need a motion and a second motion to appoint the next Mayor for the City of South Tucson. So we can ask our Vice-Mayor here to call the motion for that position.

Vice-Mayor Patino: Do we have a motion for Mayor?

Motion by Councilman Larribas to appoint Councilman Idelfonso Green as Mayor. Seconded by Councilman Cantu. Roll call vote: Councilwoman Mendoza, aye; Councilman Larribas, aye; Councilwoman Romero, nay; Vice-Mayor Patino, nay; Councilman Romo, aye; Councilman Cantu, aye. Motion passed.

Vice-Mayor Patino: Okay. You have a new Mayor and it's Idelfonso Green.

Mayor Green: Thank you.

ITEM #09 – APPOINTMENT OF VICE-MAYOR

Mayor Green: Just real quick, I'd like to thank the Council. Hopefully, we can bridge our differences. You know, so with that, I would love to appoint the Vice-Mayor. And if she will take it, Vanessa Mendoza, will you be my Vice-Mayor?

Councilwoman Mendoza: Yes, sir.

Mayor Green: Thank you very much.

Mayor Green: And I will be using the Absentee Mayor, the ...

Ms. Moreno: The Acting Mayor.

Mayor Green: The Acting Mayor, excuse me.

Ms. Moreno: Yes, that is Item #10.

Mayor Green: Yeah, the Acting Mayor, Item #10.

ITEM #10 – APPOINTMENT OF ACTING MAYOR

Mayor Green: And Robert Larribas, would you please take the position?

Councilman Larribas: Yes, sir.

Mayor Green: Thank you.

ITEM #11 – RESOLUTION NO. 16-51 OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH TUCSON, COUNTY OF PIMA, STATE OF ARIZONA, DESIGNATING AUTHORIZED SIGNATORIES FOR THE CITY OF SOUTH TUCSON BANK ACCOUNTS, PROPERTIES, AFFAIRS, BOOKS AND CORPORATE RECORDS OF THE CITY

Ms. Moreno: Thank you, Mayor, and I'd (inaudible) you, Mr. Mayor. I'll have to get used to it because I've worked with him for many years and congratulations to the Vice-Mayor and on behalf of our staff, we've been working with most of you for many, many years and we look forward to working with Mr. Councilman Green, now Mayor Green, excuse me. It's going to take a little bit of getting used to but congratulations to all of you. And Mr. Cantu, congratulations, and Mr. Romo, as well. So most of this meeting, for those in the audience who are listening, we've already passed the first part of the agenda where we formalize the appointment of the newly elected and then where we have the appointments of the Mayor and the Vice-Mayor, and the next thing to do is to formalize the signatories of the City of South Tucson. And the next item on the agenda is Resolution No. 16-51 where it will formalize Mr. Mayor Green to be a signatory for the City of South Tucson, as well as Vice-Mayor Larribas, I'm sorry, Vice-Mayor, I'm so sorry, Mendoza. I know you're acting ...

Vice-Mayor Mendoza: As long as I don't have to sign it that way.

Ms. Moreno: No, we will have lots of signatures coming up forward. This agenda here in front of you will designate both of you as signatories for the City of South Tucson. So can you please ask for a motion, Mr. Mayor?

Motion by Vice-Mayor Mendoza to approve Resolution No. 16-51. Seconded by Councilman Larribas. Motion passed unanimously.

ITEM #12 – RESOLUTION NO. 16-52 OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH TUCSON, ARIZONA, GRANTING TO SOUTHWEST GAS CORPORATION, ITS SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS, THE RIGHT, PRIVILEGE AND FRANCHISE TO CONSTRUCT, MAINTAIN AND OPERATE IN THE CITY OF SOUTH TUCSON, ARIZONA, SYSTEMS FOR THE MANUFACTURE, TRANSMISSION, DISTRIBUTION AND SALE OF GAS THROUGHOUT THE SAID CITY OF SOUTH TUCSON AND FUTURE ADDITIONS THERETO

Ms. Moreno: Thank you, Mayor. Item #12 is Resolution No. 16-52 and this is part of what was in this November 8 election. The franchise agreement with Southwest Gas was up for renewal and the franchise is for 25 years. The Proposition was on the ballot and it passed. So this item here is the agreement between the City of South Tucson and Southwest Gas for an additional 25 years. I don't know if the Finance Director would like to add to that.

Ms. Aguirre: Mayor, members of the Council, the only thing I would like to mention in addition to that is nothing really has changed. The contract with Southwest Gas as presented on August 8 is the same form in which it was published. And according to State statute, it is the same way it must be also signed and granted to the franchise company.

Mayor Green: Okay. Do we have a motion?

Motion by Vice-Mayor Mendoza to approve Resolution No. 16-52. Seconded by Councilman Patino. Motion passed unanimously.

ITEM #13 – RESOLUTION NO. 16-53 OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH TUCSON, ARIZONA, GRANTING TO TUCSON ELECTRIC POWER COMPANY, ITS SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS, THE RIGHT, PRIVILEGE AND FRANCHISE TO CONSTRUCT, MAINTAIN AND OPERATE IN THE CITY OF SOUTH TUCSON, ARIZONA, ELECTRIC POWER PLANTS AND SYSTEMS FOR THE MANUFACTURE, TRANSMISSION, DISTRIBUTION AND SALE OF ELECTRICITY THROUGHOUT THE SAID CITY OF SOUTH TUCSON AND FUTURE ADDITIONS THERETO

Ms. Moreno: Thank you, Mayor. And this is basically identical to Item #12. This is (inaudible) Tucson Electric Power. So, again, it's a Proposition that was on the ballot and this is for an additional 25 years. And as Lourdes indicated, it's according, everything is equal, the same identical (inaudible).

Mayor Green: Do we have a motion?

Motion by Vice-Mayor Mendoza to approve Resolution No. 16-53. Seconded by Councilman Patino.
Motion passed unanimously.

ITEM #14 – REPORTS

Ms. Moreno: Thank you, Mayor, members of the Council. We don't have any reports right now, but I would just like to let the two newly elected Council members know that I know that this is a lot for you all to (inaudible) but we will get all of you started here in the weeks to come. I don't foresee a meeting here until maybe the second or third week in January where we will have the League of Cities of Towns down to conduct an orientation on basically your roles as elected officials. In the meantime, I will be providing you with some documentation to get you started here officially at City Hall. So I will forward them to you right now at the end of the meeting, but aside from that, all of us are here for whatever it is that you need. And again, I want to congratulate all of you. Thank you all very much.

Vice-Mayor Mendoza: Mr. Mayor, if I can, just during Reports, I had asked Denise, our Office Manager, and she spoke with Veronica as well, I don't know in how depth, but I just wanted to have every Council member aware that I got an email, and I'm sure as well most of you did too, by For Tucson. There's a reception and blessing breakfast for First Responders and elected officials on January 27th. So it should be in your email somewhere. I think that I would like to know, kind of, if we can get, gather some information as far as whether or not South Tucson Fire Department and Police Department ever participate in that. And if not, or if so, I would like to see a sponsored table for each of the departments so that way our First Responders can absolutely be there. So I know that the tables are like \$150 each for a table of eight, but I definitely think that our First Responders are important, they're probably ...

Mayor Green: They're well ...

Vice-Mayor Mendoza: ... the most ...

Mayor Green: ... (inaudible).

Vice-Mayor Mendoza: ... important. So if we can kind of just get together and gather some more information, I would love to be able to make sure we have some sponsored tables for our South Tucson Police Department and Fire Department.

Mayor Green: Okay. Thank you very much.

Vice-Mayor Mendoza: As well as for elected officials as well. So it's a brunch for elected officials, or breakfast for elected officials and First Responders.

Mayor Green: Thank you.

Vice-Mayor Mendoza: Just an FYI.

Mayor Green: Can you look into that?

Ms. Moreno: Definitely. Thank you, Vice-Mayor. Denise did mention it to me and, yes, definitely we'll make sure that we get a couple of tables for the elected officials and we'll invite everyone in the Police and Fire Department as well.

ITEM #15 – CALL TO THE AUDIENCE

Mayor Green: Agenda item #15 is Call to the Audience. Anybody wishing to talk to the audience, or to the Council, may approach. You have three minutes. Ma'am.

Ms. Kunz: Okay. I have (inaudible) package. (Inaudible). And I went to Pima County. I also went to City ...

Vice-Mayor Mendoza: Ma'am, I'm sorry, can I ask you to start at the podium?

Mayor Green: At the podium, please.

Ms. Kunz: I want to give you these first.

Vice-Mayor Mendoza: Just tell 'em, just ...

Mayor Green: Just, just ...

Vice-Mayor Mendoza: ... state your name ...

Mayor Green: ... (inaudible) ...

Vice-Mayor Mendoza: ... (inaudible) ...

Mayor Green: ... and then we'll pass them out.

Vice-Mayor Mendoza: Yeah.

Ms. Kunz: Okay.

Mayor Green: Put 'em all here.

Vice-Mayor Mendoza: Thank you.

Ms. Kunz: My name is Patty Kunz. I own old Lou's Plumbing. I owns one block South 4th Avenue and 34th Street. When I took over 2010, Lou's Plumbing was still operating in that place. And then ...

Mayor Green: (Inaudible).

Ms. Kunz: ... (inaudible) took over. But anyway, spend \$65,000 cleaning up that place. It's big mess, okay? After I clean up, you know, and then people ask me favor. Matter of fact, City of South Tucson asked me a favor to use that for a carnival for the City of South Tucson street fair. Okay. I let them use. But they didn't tell me that was no right zoning. So when the neighbor asked me they want to leave the car there for (inaudible) if they make money, they going to stay in the country. If they don't make money, I'm okay with it. They can leave. Okay? Then I got a couple letter from Zoning Department. Okay. And tell me I'm not allowed to do this, I'm not allowed to do that. Okay? Because they told me the minute I moved my car, I move everything out, I lost the rights. Okay? So I went to Pima County today. I also went to City today, the Zoning, okay? They told me, oh, so they overcharge me for my property, yes, I told them why wasn't I (inaudible). Okay? He wrote the letter there in a package. Lou's Plumbing owns all the properties. Longer add license that, that zoning does not change. They continue the zoning. He wrote a letter there.

Mayor Green: I know, Ma'am. I, we ...

Ms. Kunz: (Inaudible) ...

Mayor Green: ... didn't have enough ...

Councilman Patino: We didn't have copies.

(Simultaneous conversation)

Ms. Kunz: There should be seven there. Okay. In this, there was (inaudible). They spent four hours with me. Okay. To explain to me. This is the page he read (inaudible) also told me I was run out of time. No, he ran out of time. But he say if you guys want a formal letter, he will send a formal letter. He put his business card in the bottom here. Okay? And then he also gave me this map. When I, when my neighbor (inaudible) my lot to use, they also took a picture. Okay? They told me this whole thing is a parcel. I went to City of South Tucson. They told me, oh, no, that's a separate parcel. You cannot use that. It's Lou's Plumbing, wherever. Okay. It wasn't. They tax me a whole thing in one parcel. Okay? The whole thing. One package. They, he will explain to you in a letter. Okay? He told me that longer I have my business license, I can do that anything for storage, resale (inaudible) wholesale. Okay? But City of South Tucson does not agree with that. So I told them I want my money back. Because they overcharge me almost \$580 a year. Okay? I say I want my money back. You don't want let me use my property? I want my money back. They say no. Go back to South Tucson to, he wrote me a letter to talk, te-, asking me to see the Council people to explain to them the whole thing was charged as a one parcel. Even the, even addresses, give them parcels. When they tax me, they charge me as one. Because Lou's Plumbing owns the, the, the storage yard because they were storage pipes, they storage fittings. Okay. When I took over, I don't like that look. I want clean up. I think the City of South Tucson is a very beautiful City, if they're willing to clean up. Okay? So I put a lot of money into clean that place up. So if I come up, do as example for other people so other people willing to clean up as I do. Okay? So that's one thing I think that, you know, now I get penalized because I clean up. I spend \$65,000 to clean that place up. Now I get penalized. Now Zoning Department keeps sending a letter to tell me I cannot do this, I cannot do that, you know. If I move out and I did park (inaudible) car there. I lost two engines. Somebody stole two of my engines, okay? So I move my car back to, in the other side, okay? Now, the Jeff Auto asked me, because

they look after my store, and they said well if it work out for us, if we park one here (inaudible) sharing the money, we'll sign a lease with you. And then wherever we agreed, you know, then the City of South Tucson can make money, too. But, you know, then when I get letter from the Zoning Department telling me no, I cannot do this, I cannot do that, so I went to Pima County. I went to Treasurer's Department. He has business card there.

Mayor Green: Okay.

(Several minutes of conversation continue between Mayor Green and Ms. Kunz)

Mayor Green: You're jumping all over. The best thing to do is for the sake of continuing the meeting is set up an appointment because you've already, have the County, the City, Tucson Water, our inspectors, Public Works, everything, is just, it's just too much to sit here and discuss.

Ms. Kunz: Sure.

Mayor Green: And I'm not trying to be rude. Because we really can't answer any of your questions now. If you get with the City Manager, you know, we can get with the individuals that need to be there, the inspector, Planning and Zoning, the Director of Public Works, and we can get there and do this, that would probably be the best thing to do.

Ms. Kunz: Okay. I agree with you on that. But I would like to know how can I get a meeting with City Councilmen and the City of South Tucson? Because I do not want to have you say something, they say something.

(Conversation continues for a few minutes)

Mayor Green: Okay. After 5:00, or whatever, I can sit in the meeting.

Ms. Kunz: Okay.

Mayor Green: So, it would have to probably wait until after the New Year.

Ms. Kunz: Sure, of course.

Mayor Green: Because of the Christmas holidays. So let's go ahead and look at, when are we having the meeting on Monday the, oh, right here. The second or third Monday. You'll be notified as to when the meeting is.

Ms. Kunz: Okay.

Mayor Green: Okay. It's either going to be the second week of, or second Monday in January, or the third Monday in January. If that's the case, let's go ahead and put that, and I'll make it a point to attend the meeting.

Ms. Kunz: Okay. Great. The appointment is just me and the City Council and ...

Mayor Green: No, no. It's not going to be the City Council. It's going ...

Ms. Kunz: Okay.

Mayor Green: ... to be staff.

Ms. Kunz: Sure.

Mayor Green: And myself. I mean, ...

Ms. Kunz: Okay.

Mayor Green: ... and any other Council member that wants to. I cannot dictate ...

Ms. Kunz: Sure.

Mayor Green: ... to the Council.

Ms. Kunz: I understand. No problem. Thank you.

Mayor Green: Okay? Thank you. Anybody else? Step forward.

Mr. Boyle: Your Honor, Council members, it's a pleasure to see such a handsome Council. It's long overdue. And it's also a pleasure to see you all still here with us and struggling with us in this City to help this City become what the City should be. And to all the new friends and the new faces, the old faces I have here, thank you for coming out. I have something to share with everyone here this evening because I bear good news. Finally. We've been involved in the community of Tucson and I say we, United States Marine Corps League, 007 Division, for the Southern Arizona that represents the United States Armed Forces and the Marine Corps League. My directive as of last year was to go forward and assist the community in developing what we can do for our community as veterans serving this City, the City of South Tucson. We first approached the Mayor and Council a while back, many years ago, about a memorial that would represent the City and the families, 129 families, who suffer the casualty of war, who have lost their father, their mother, their children, in serving our country. In respect, we wanted to build a memorial to them. At the time, we had a great deal of burden upon our City and it wasn't advisable for us to go forward with our City, but to bring a reputation to our City that is disadvantaged by representation. We thought it would be best to approach the City of Tucson with our ideals for who we are in this City, and how we act as a culture in the City. We're a fine City. We're an Americana City, and very responsible to the country's opinion of who we are as Americanas in this City. Going forward, we were able to accomplish, though my name may be on this, and though other things are mentioned on what I'm going to present to you, it is not me. I have served your City for over eight years. You have honored me with the privilege of being the Chairman of your Board of Adjustors and we have made changes that were a crisis to our City because of our election to do the right thing in the City, and to follow the protocols a good government swears to do for us as people. I have been a merchant in your City for 37 years, and I intend to stay here until I die. What I have here is what you have earned. All of you have earned. I'm going to present it to the City Manager because she has been managing the City while we were all busy. But the Marines have brought it home for you. And you are recognized throughout the United States of

America, as of now, as the first City to recognize in honor and remembering the American Families of America who have given you your children, their children, or their parents. There are a great deal of organizations that got involved with us because of this and they are aware you are present now. They would like your involvement in the organizations and we have two members this evening here to represent our City to bring organizations into your City. I will introduce her to you, who is your community liaison officer for your business association, for your community's development to organize and assist you, our politicians, our leaders, in the benefit of our community and its future. I will present this to your City Manager to read and then I will invite the young lady up to say what she has to say.

Ms. Moreno: This is a Proclamation and the title says, City of Tucson, Office of the Mayor. Whereas, or may I, Mayor?

Mayor Green: Yes, you may.

Ms. Moreno: Whereas the City of Tucson, Arizona, is home to many veterans, both those who are originally from here and those who have moved from here to other places. And whereas, together with First Responders, our military veterans exemplify America's finest ideals of allure and patriotism, and whereas, Tucson residents, Thomas G. Boyle and Mike Pierce, have worked to promote patriotism through education action with various organizations, including the City of South Tucson Business Association, the City of South Tucson's Veteran Court, the Marine Corps League, Tucson Detachment, the League of Latin American Citizens, Council 1057, and the Knights of Columbus Veterans Recognition Dinner and they wish to honor all American Veterans and their families, especially those who hail or reside in Tucson and surrounding areas; whereas, September 11, 2016, marks the 15th anniversary of attack on our nation that left thousands dead, including hundreds of valiant First Responders and those attacks led to United State war in Afghanistan and Iraq in which tens of thousands of Americans served and nearly two hundred military service members with ties to Arizona were killed; and, whereas, it is fitting that we honor the victims of those attacks and the sacrifices of our military service members and veterans by flying the American flag at half staff on this anniversary. Now, therefore, I, Jonathan Rothschild, Mayor of the City of Tucson, Arizona, do hereby proclaim September 11, 2016, to be "Honor Our Patriots Day" in this community and encourage all residents to commemorate this day. In witness thereof, I have unto set my hand and cause the seal of the City of Tucson, Arizona, to be affixed this 11th day of September, 2016. Signed, Jonathon Rothschild, Mayor.

Mr. Boyle: What it has accomplished is that every veteran that dies in the State of Arizona, his burial flag will fly for 30 days over Tucson, Arizona, to represent all those who sacrificed their lives and patriotism. You have accomplished this, not Tucson. They're just recognizing what you have created here. I am here. I started all of this right here with the Marine Corps League because they (inaudible). And they are (inaudible). Mr. Mayor, I would like to introduce to you your Community Liaison Officer, Ms. (inaudible) would you mind coming up? I will give the floor to her for one moment. She has something to express to you that I think you'll be impressed. Please introduce yourself to the Mayor and Council.

Ms. Martinez: Mayor, Mayor and Council, my name is Savine (ph) Martinez. I'm from Mexico. So, we want to improve this (inaudible). We want to prove that what Mexican people can do here, that we can do the things well. Actually, I'm learning English. I have no perfect language, but I'm here and I

want to do good things. Here is my sister as well. Her name is (inaudible). She's sixteen. She wants to be involved in LULAC. Do you know what LULAC is? Here we are together and we want to be part of this City. We want to be part of this country.

Mayor Green: Thank you.

Ms. Martinez. Thank you.

Mayor Green: Anybody else wishing to speak to the Council?

Judge Lassen: Mr. Mayor, if I may rise just for a minute. May I stay over here?

Mayor Green: Yes, you may.

Judge Lassen: I just want to tell you this one feel good thing and it could be an opportunity for any of you, or for any of the audience, too. The Court has received a, it's called a Community Reinvestment Grant. It's not large, but it's many thousands of dollars and it has limited uses, and here they are. One, you passed back through in the office on your way out you're going to see a big stack of boxes there. This is one of the first investments that the Community Reinvestment Grant, the Court has put together Winter Survival Kits and they consist of a cap, a poncho with gloves, diabetic socks, a couple of packs of Kleenex and Chap stick, a pair of (inaudible) in a tote bag. Anyone who likes, we've got plenty of poor people roaming around the City of South Tucson. Anyone who likes, can come to the Court any day from 8:00 to 4:30, come up to the window and ask for one. And these are available. We have a hundred available now and (inaudible) we'll have more. We also have several hundred daily bus passes that we can pass out. These are available for people who have no transportation either to get home from the City of South Tucson to some place else to the City, or people who are in South Tucson can (inaudible) bus pass to get to a treatment provider, a medical or social service or mental health treatment provider, and also people who need bus passes to get back and forth to court. Again, these are available at the Courts window for the asking, Monday through Friday from 8:00 to 4:30. There's also a limited sum of money (inaudible) find them here, people who are stranded in South Tucson who are from other places and (inaudible) get home. And we can arrange transportation home, also, for the down and out (inaudible). So those are the issues that the Community Reinvestment Grant (inaudible) just recently got (inaudible) a couple days ago got the stuff in. And just a couple days ago, got the bus passes here. Those are all available at the Court. Thank you.
