



CITY OF SOUTH TUCSON RESOLUTION NO: 14-29

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH TUCSON, ARIZONA, RATFYING AND APPROVING THE GRANT-IN-AID AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF SOUTH TUCSON, ARIZONA, A CORPORATE BODY POLITIC (THE "GRANTEE") AND THE TOHONO O'ODHAM NATION, A FEDERALLY RECOGNIZED INDIAN TRIBE (THE "NATION") AND AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF THIS RESOLUTION, FOR THE PURPOSE OF AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF SOUTH TUCSON TO EXECUTE THE AGREEMENT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY TO EXIST

WHEREAS, the GRANTEE, by and through Mayor and Council, is authorized to enter into Agreements, if authorized by its governing body, with Federal, State, Local and Tribal Governments or public agencies pursuant to A.R.S. §§ 9-499.01 and 11-952; and

WHEREAS, the NATION, by and through the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council, is authorized to negotiate and conclude agreements on behalf of the NATION with federal, State and Local governments pursuant to the Constitution of the NATION, Article VI, § 1(f): and

WHEREAS, the NATION, by and through the Chairman of the Nation, is authorized to sign the agreement with Federal, State and local governments upon passage of a Resolution by the Legislative Council approving the agreement pursuant to the Constitution of the NATION, Article VII, § 2(f); and

WHEREAS, the GRANTEE and the NATION desire to enter into a Grant-in-Aid Agreement for the payment and distribution of the contribution by the NATION for Fire Fighter TURN OUT GEAR in the amount of \$85,921.66 as described under the terms of the agreement; and

WHEREAS, the GRANTEE and the NATION desire to have this item presented to the South Tucson Mayor and City Council at its October 15, 2014 Council meeting; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of South Tucson have determined

that it is in the best interest of the City of South Tucson, Arizona and its citizens to formally pass and adopt the "Grant-in-Aid Agreement" with the Tohono O'odham Nation; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the preservation of the peace, health, and safety of the City of South Tucson, Arizona, that an emergency be declared to exist to assure timely approval and adoption of the Agreement, and that this Resolution be effective immediately upon its passage and adoption.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the City of South Tucson, Arizona, that the GRANTEE hereby formally ratifies and approves the execution of said "Grant-in-Aid Agreement" and empowers the Mayor of the City of South Tucson to execute said document.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the City of South Tucson, Arizona, that due to an existing emergency declared herein, the immediate effectiveness of this Resolution is necessary to preserve the peace, health, and safety of the City of South Tucson, Arizona, and this Resolution shall therefore be effective upon its passage and adoption.
